This season, as the weather gradually warmed up, we were able to spend more time on park improvements, which otherwise were impractical during the colder weather. We were able to improve the lighting at Cedar Valley Shelter One with brand new light fixtures. These new light

fixtures dramatically improve the light level in the building and should offer shelter users a better experience.

To go along with the new and improved lighting here, we were able to build and install a

countertop similar to the one installed at our Massillon Park shelter. In addition to the


countertop and lighting, we made a few cosmetic improvements to the shelter. This is one of our most popular shelters for day use and reservations alike. It is always our goal to improve our visitors experience and help facilitate memorable events and gatherings.

The last couple of months also saw us performing some general upkeep duties in the park, including tree trimming around the parks and in campgrounds. We do this pruning at this time to minimize damage to young trees and give them the best chance to recover unhindered by various

pests and diseases. Finally, Bennett Park shower house received a small upgrade in the form of hand dryers. These small dryers receive their power from the solar panels near the shower house and will help save on cost and waste from paper towels, though towels will still be available for those who choose to use them. We are looking forward to the start of camping season and seeing new and regulars alike!







The bird is between 8" and 12" in length with a wingspan of 20" to 24". These birds are a common sight along highways where they perch on signposts and electric wires where they keep an eye out for prey in open areas. They have a wide-ranging diet consisting of insects, small mammals, and small birds, which has aided in their wide range and relative abundance. Adult males and females have similar body sizes but differ in coloration. Males have blue-grey wings with a rufous back, while females have rufous wings and back.


A combination of a free weekend and higher-than-normal temperatures during the first part of February afforded me the opportunity to take a long hike out in the woods at Townsend Wildlife Area. While I initially set out looking for antlers, I soon found myself transfixed by the oft-overlooked smaller world around me. I found myself slowing down to examine the world around me, noticing the small pops of color that don't always catch our eyes right away.

My exploration soon took me off trail as I followed deer paths deeper into the woods, stopping every so often to examine fallen logs and peer into old tree cavities. Before my eyes I saw a tiny world unfold, full of homes, hideaways, and miniature ecosystems all their own. While I have long been aware of these miniature landscapes, it is always nice to reexplore them while out and about.

Between bouts of these micro-adventures, I began wondering about the lives of the animals that use these landscapes. I knew of the signs of animals themselves, but I asked myself why they chose these specific locations. Perhaps this hideaway was simply close by, utilized purely by proximity, or a squirrel found refuge here on its way to its main cache, having narrowly escaped the clutching talons of an owl. The world may never know.



It may come as a surprise that I found no antlers that day, being as engrossed as I was in this word up close. I became lost in the forests and prairies formed of moss and forgot my main goal. In doing so, though, I had found again my sense of wonder and curiosity in the natural world, taking on an adventure close to home that is

Beeswax Food Wraps

Please have an adult help you with the following project

Equipment

Pinking Shears
Oven
Cookie Sheet
Clean Paint Brush

Ingredients

Around 1 tbsp. grated beeswax or beeswax pellets 1 piece of 100% cotton fabric cut to size with the pinking shears

Method

- 1. Pre-heat the oven to 350° F.
- 2. Place your piece of fabric face down on the cookie sheet. Spread beeswax evenly over the top of your fabric.
- 3. Place the fabric in the oven and watch carefully. Only leave it in long enough to melt the beeswax, 1 to 2 minutes should be enough.
- 4. Use the paintbrush to spread the melted wax evenly over your fabric.
- 5. Let your waxed fabric cool and dry on a flat surface.
- 6. Once cooled completely it is ready to use!



Wild Recipe: Spruce Cone Syrup

Equipment

1 quart mason jar

Ingredients

2 cups young clean green spruce cones

2 1/2 cups of brown or unrefined sugar

Method

- 1. Combine cones and sugar in your mason jar in layers; lay one layer of cones and then sugar, repeating your process until the jar is full.
- 2. Let your jar sit for around 30 days, allowing the mixture to combine and ferment. During the first week, open the jar every day to release gas. During this process the volume may decrease; if you have more cones and sugar, you can add them to your jar, filling it to the top of the jar again.
- 3. At the end of the 30-day period, your syrup will be a liquid or slush in consistency. Transfer this mixture to a saucepan with two tablespoons of water for each quart of syrup and heat to a brisk boil, stirring frequently. Cook for 5 to 10 minutes, being sure not to reduce your syrup too much as it will crystallize.
- 4. After your syrup is finished cooking, strain out your cones and transfer to a clean jar. Discard the strained cones. Process the jars in a water bath as for canning for additional quality.
- 5. For best flavor, refrigerate your syrup.
