Re; Application of the Phillips Petroleum Company
for a change in location of driveway entrance.

The Zoning Board of Adjustment met at the Courthouse in Tipton, Iowa
at 3:00 P.M., June 22nd, 1965, with the following members present:
Paul Busching, Lester Chambliss, Ferd Goettsch, and Ted Worrall.

The purpose of the meeting was to consider the request of the Phillips
Petroleum Company for a change in the location of the driveway entrance
to their property in the southwest quadrant of Interstate #80 and
County Road D near West Branch, Iowa. Said request would permit them
to move aforementioned driveway approximately 300 feet north of its
present location.

Inasmuch as this proposed location would not comply with the present
Zoning Ordinance which governs the required sight distance between the
driveway entrance and the on-coming traffic, and would, therefore, be
detrimental to the welfare and safety of the traveling public: the
Zoning Board of Adjustment, by unanimous vote, rejected the permit
requested.
